What is a spill?

A spill is a discharge of one or more hazardous substances that adversely impact, or threaten to adversely impact, human health, welfare, or the environment and requires an immediate response.

Do I have to report my spill?

Your spill is reportable to the DNR if:

- There is an impact to human health
- There is an impact to the environment
- There is a fire, explosion or safety hazard
- You have not immediately cleaned up the spill
- The spill was more than the reportable quantity listed below
 - \circ \quad Petroleum product completely contained on an impervious surface
 - o 1 gallon of gasoline
 - 5 gallons of petroleum
 - o 250 lbs. dry fertilizer
 - o 25 gallons of liquid fertilizer
 - o Pesticides that would cover less than 1 acre of land if applied according to label instructions
 - Meets the federal reportable quantity outlines in the <u>CERCLA RQ column of the EPA's Lists of Lists</u>

WHOPRS Multi-Factor Authentication

In late March 2024, the Wisconsin Hazmat Online Planning and Reporting System (WHOPRS) will be implementing Multi-factor Authentication when logging in going forward. The update includes a significant set of Security Changes

and the latest regulatory and product updates. Due to these changes, each user for all roles will need to verify their email addresses and will need to enter the codes that are sent to their email address. If users are sharing user accounts, they will not be able to complete the login process.
