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Minutes

1) System update

- a. To date, WI-CAMS contains 25,862 credentialed personnel across 2,157 organizations.
- b. Salamander Technologies has announced that through August 1 2018, they will offer a temporary reduction on the minimum number of TRACK licenses required for new customers. The minimum will be reduced from 5 to 3.
- c. Agency updates:
 - i. Kevin Wernet mentioned that in future exercises sponsored by DMA, a key area for improvement will be to expand the use of accountability at additional venues. This goal came out of an initial Dark Sky exercise assessment. This initiative was also encouraged out of a desire to revisit partnerships with private sector points of contact.
 - ii. UW Madison Police are considering how to use WI-CAMS accountability functions at future events.
 - iii. Wisconsin State Patrol worked with WEM staff to display Command software in the State EOC to provide a real-time picture of accountability for Dark Sky participants. State Patrol is also planning on a possible re-issue of IDs for staff.
 - iv. Wisconsin DNR's Law Enforcement Bureau already has plans to move towards WI-CAMS in the near future and is in the midst of planning for that implementation.

2) DOA single ID proposal

- a. The Department of Administration plans to use WI-CAMS as the sole identification standard for all state agencies under their purview. This would apply to all permanent, project, limited term, seasonal or contract employees but not military operating on state orders. Photos taken within 7 years are valid for this project.
 - i. Per current policy, any state employees with emergency support functions would need to have their IDs laminated with the proper authentication laminate.
 - ii. Just-in-time credentials issued in an exercise or emergency are not considered valid identification.
 - iii. For agencies with personnel who feel displaying partial or full names poses a security risk, they are still required to present a WI-CAMS ID when entering other buildings following this policy.
- b. Per Chris Litzkow with Capitol Police, the deadline for the changeover to the new system is December 2018. DOA has been training state agencies on how to use the new system.
 - i. DOA also plans to distribute guidance and provide training on recognizing state seals, colored bands, etc. for building access managers and contract security.
 - ii. Additional guidance will be added to DOA's policy that consider how this proposal will interface with existing access policies at state agencies.
- c. Following a set of inquiries from Department of Children and Families on behalf of DOA, WEM will explore the possibility of combining HID/smartchip systems with the Salamander solution.



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3) LE Chaplain qualification update

- a. The qualification was revised to read “The State of Wisconsin requires a minimum of Basic Credentialed Law Enforcement Chaplain” rather than “Law Enforcement Officer.” “2 CEUs required yearly in LE Chaplain field to maintain credential” was also added. Both changes were approved by Wisconsin’s Law Enforcement Credentialing Committee.

4) WEM is still working on incorporating additional HazMat qualifications.

5) OneResponder and NQS

- a. WEM is engaged in conversation with FEMA on exploring integration between the NQS/OneResponder and the Salamander solution. The policy group will continue to be updated with new developments.

6) Additional comments

- a. Chris Litzkow briefed the policy group on news that air qualifications are currently in development. He also received feedback about the Canine Vapor Wake qualification that he will relay to the Law Enforcement Credentialing Committee.
